John Brady's is a jig written by the man himself, a flute player from Offaly. John's daughter, Attracta Brady, often teaches at Scoil Éigse (she taught some of our adult students at Drogheda in 2018). Attracta was also, coincidentally, in Norah Rendell's class for the MA in Irish Traditional Music Performance at the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance at the University of Limerick some years ago. Some locals have learned this tune from Laura MacKenzie and others learned it from Paddy O'Brien. Brian Miller brought this tune in for the Advanced Youth ensemble a couple of years ago and they play it in a set after the Kilmovee jig. Enjoy!
